There are essentially four main service components: 1) Intake which provides medical and psycho- social assessment for clients who have been accepted into treatment with DASA funded/licensed treatment providers with whom we have an agreement to provide these services; and 2) Information and referral individuals seeking treatment for a substance abuse problem; 3) Central intake also has a specialized service component for women which provides, in addition to general services and specialized referral and placement services; 4) HIV/AIDS counseling, testing, and case management is also offered on the premises.

Graduated outpatient groups from four hours a day, five days a week for three months to two hours a day, three days a week, then two hours a day, two times a week. Substance abuse education, parenting training, abuse education, individual and group counseling are all part of the program. Transportation is provided in special cases.

A behavior level system is used for the women to provide structure and allow progressively earning more personal freedom. Accepting responsibility for one's actions and exercising good life choices for self and family is emphasized.

Currently accepts no children over the age of six.

Description of Services:

To provide primary alcohol and drug residential treatment to addicted women, especially pregnant and postpartum women while allowing their infants and preschoolers to remain with them during their treatment stay. Clients may bring three of their children (ages 0-5 years of age) with them to treatment. The treatment program is designed to facilitate recovery from substance dependence by offering a structured, therapeutic environment for all clients. Individual and group counseling and individualized treatment planning is also available.

Bilingual services if offered in Spanish: Yes

Hours of Operation: 24 hours a day

Geographical Area Served: Chicago and surrounding areas.

Duration of Services: Six months or longer depending on each individual case.

Specific Intake Times: Monday through Friday 9:00 am-3:00 pm

Fee Structure: Medicaid, third party insurance, and indigent clients are accepted. A small fee is assessed at the AFDC payment levels for children's room and board.

Eligibility Criteria: Females of childbearing age 18 years and up have at least five days or have admission criteria regardless of their ability to pay fees.

Exclusion: The applicant is actively experiencing psychotic manifestations or other severe mental or physical illness, which requires acute medical or psychiatric care.

Additional Comments: Specialized services provided are as follows: parent classes, supervised parent-child interaction, educational self-awareness, functional life skills, health care, and case management for mother and children, and well-baby care. Licensed infant/toddler day care on-site. State pre-kindergarten program on site. Children served from six weeks to five years of age. Children need physical and medical records with them. It would be helpful if women would have prenatal care set in place. Women must be at least eighteen years old. Program is handicap accessible.
